

The existing journals, with their well-tested functionalities, should be retained and developed to meet the demands of 21st century research, while the underlying payment streams undergo a major restructuring. There is sufficient momentum for this decisive push towards open access publishing.

Survey among IATUL member libraries

- between Juli 2013 and February 2014
- 100 respondents out of 193 (52%)

Policy Project - Findings

23 national policies or frameworks for Information Literacy

38 libraries have an institutional IL policy or standards

Diverse modes of integration into university profiles:

- Embedded into Academic Integrity Statement
- Part of library strategic plan
- Part of the university's teaching and learning policies
- Part of a learner's guide






Self-evaluation of SIG IL
